

It's Not Figgy Puddin'!


Well several months have gone by since the HOT BS survey closed its doors, for which I must apologize. The survey response rate was astounding, with 72 respondents. 93% of the responders were members of the club and these represented approximately 50% of the current membership.

I have now generated graphical summaries of the responses and collated the free responses. This was initially a little daunting, as there were over 700 free response comments to organize. In collating the results I have tried to put comments of a similar nature together, in an ordered fashion, but have NOT removed or changed any comments: other than to capitalize comments and to remove duplicated short comments. Where I have removed short duplicate comments, I have noted in parentheses how many people also expressed the same comment.

The results of the survey are very much more heartwarming and informative than anyone could ever have hoped for or wished. So many of you kindly participated and expressed your views of and wishes for the club. I think it is vital and constructive for everyone, to have free access to the complete report of the results and comments. They make very interesting reading, indeed.

As there was so much information collected in the survey, I will summarize the results in the next 3 or 4 issues of the Bear Briefs. In addition the collated results are available online to members. By handling things in this fashion, everyone can see the summaries to all of the questions in each section and while also viewing the complete views of all of the survey respondents.

After all of the results have been discussed in the Bear Briefs, I will publish an extensive report to the web for everyone to review at their leisure. Assembly of the collated result summary has been no mean feat – the summary results currently occupies 40 pages, including all of the summary graphs and free responses. However, I think it is important for everyone to have the opportunity to appreciate the factors which unite us, both as a community and a club. I also think it is vital that the views of the whole membership regarding management issues and growth of the group be accessible by all club members. This information represents a vital and unique opportunity for everyone to get to know the heart and mind of the membership. This information will also offer a great opportunity to spark communication within the group and encourage your active participation in shaping and uniting our group.


In the first few Bear Brief articles I will summarize the more practical issues raised in the survey. For instance, ‘which events are the most popular’, ‘what can be done to improve the current events’ and ‘what new events would the membership like to see’. After this I will publish the more subjective section of the survey – ‘why members joined the club’, ‘how satisfied are the membership with the club’, ‘what the membership derive from the club’, ‘how would the membership like to see their club grow and develop’.

The survey responses were exceptionally positive and constructive on the whole and hugely supportive of the group and our community. However, a number of concerns and criticisms were raised. I will do my best to highlight these and address them in each article, as they arise within each section. Again, everyone can view all of the comments and obtain an sense of the context of any criticisms by reviewing the collated results on the web along with the bear brief articles.

So without further ado, lets have a look at some of the results from the survey. As mentioned 93% of the survey respondents are HOTB members, 64% of which are active in the club. The average number of events attended per month is 1.3, with 32% of respondents attend one event per month, 24% attend two events per month and 10% attend three events per month. encumbrance to attendance was assessed from the free responses and was identified as time limitations; due to work constraints and not being conveniently located within Austin.

67% of respondents expressed interest in weekday events, while 90% of respondents expressed interest in weekend events. Again one of the primary limitations for interest in weekday events was the lack of free time during the week and work constraints. The lower interest of respondents in weekday events was also demonstrated in the attendance rate of each individual event. There was generally lower attendance of events which are scheduled during the week, compared to the weekend (figure below).



Interest in bear events, either on week days or weekends did not appear to be strongly seasonal. Only 26% of respondents felt that interest in weekday events was seasonal and 29% of respondents felt that interest in weekend events was seasonal. Again the chief reason cited for lack of interest in events, can be summarized by time limitations. There was, however, interest expressed in scheduling outdoor activities in the spring, fall and winter; when the weather is pleasant. This will be worth bearing in mind by the board, as there is strong interest from the membership for more outdoor actives and these may best be scheduled during the more clement times.

The best days and times for activities was examined and the best days for weekday events was shown to be Wednesdays and Friday evenings starting around 6.00 to 7.00 pm. The best days and times for weekend events was shown to be either Saturday (45% of respondents) afternoons (64% of respondents) or all weekend (30% of respondents). Additionally respondents felt that Friday (20%) evenings around 6.00 – 7.00 pm (62%) would be a good time for events. This information can certainly be used to help optimize event timing and planning in the future.

As the next section would be most fairly handled together, I will finish with the summary for now. We will continue in the next Bear Brief with an breakdown of the individual current events and members views of those events. This will be very helpful for improving the already warmly received offerings.

For now the only thing left for me to do is to wish each and everyone of you a very Merry Christmas.
