H.O.T. B.S. (Survey) Results

Pinch of concern, a dab of dialog, and an overwhelmingly cohesive club!

This is the last of the planned articles to discuss the HOTB Survey. We have so far seen that a large proportion of the membership took considerable time to express their opinions and wishes for their club. About 50% of the current membership participated in the survey, which had 72 responses. In the last two articles we reviewed the tangible results of the survey. In this article we will address respondents feelings about their club and wishes for the future development of the group. I will also address a number of concerns which were raised by the survey respondents and will offer some of my personal views regarding these concerns.

Previously we saw that members attend on average 1.3 events per month, with weekend events currently being the most popular offerings of the club; with 90% of survey responders expressing an interest in these events. The beer busts were by far the most popular event which is currently offered, these are attended by 74% of survey responders. Bear breakfast were the second most popular event, with 60% of survey responders attending. Back to the Woods and UnRuns were the third most popular events, with 50% of survey responders attending these.

The tangible views of the survey responders can certainly provide immediate guidance to both the current and future boards, with scheduling and planning of events. It is apparent that the longer running events are by far the most popular and most well known of the events, with survey responders. Therefore, it may be prudent to initially organize new events or less well attended events initially at a consistent venue and time, with broad methods of advertising, in order to allow these events to reach the full awareness of the membership as a whole.


This month we will explore the views of the survey responders regarding their feelings about their club and their wishes for their club's future development. We will view both the responders comments on the factors which unite the group as a whole and concerns that survey responders expressed. At the end of the article I will provide my personal views regarding the small number of persistent concerns which were expressed throughout the free response sections of the survey. In addition I will discuss how these concerns may be used to positively help the current and future boards and membership to continue to maintain and enrich what is currently a highly vibrant and great club. So lets first look at survey responders views on how their membership fees are spent.

Membership Fees

As can be seen from figure 1, 75% of survey responders felt that their membership fees had been well or very well spent. In fact only 1.4% of responders felt that their membership fees had not been well spent. In addition, survey respondents expressed their positive views regarding the breadth of social offerings and worthy courses supported by the club, of which their fees and individual member contributions provide.

However, a couple of survey responders commented that they did not know where their membership fees actually went. Any lack of knowledge where membership fees go, can be rectified. If there is sufficient interest by the membership, we can find a venue to publicize the monthly expenses and income of the

club. As a board we have discussed whether the Bear Briefs would be suitable venue, but it was felt that as this was a public document that this may not be the best approach. Please let us know whether you feel if it would be helpful and of interest to you to regularly see the expenditure of the club and where your investment goes. In additional, all members can view the budget and costs of the club, at the quarterly and monthly meetings.




Is your membership fee well spent?

Reasons For Joining The Club Been Met?

In addition to the majority of survey responders feeling that their fees had been well spent, 76% of survey responders felt that their reasons for joining the club had been met (figure 2). However, 8% of survey responders felt that their reasons for joining the club had not been met. Further analysis of these respondents indicated that most of these respondents either were not current members of the group, had not currently been to any events or, in the case of a single responder, did not care for the board and its views.

The views of survey respondents regarding whether their 'reasons for joining the club had been met', begs the question of 'what were the members reasons for joining the club?' This was assessed through free response questions. I was both delighted and surprised with the comments, which highlighted a strong sense unity among respondents and a consistent motivation for joining the group. There was also an equally strong sense of rewards achieved through membership of the group.

Survey responders consistently and resoundingly expressed their views that they valued and obtained: camaraderie, a sense of family and brotherhood, closeness, generosity and belonging; by 'being a member of an established social group with a large membership of handsome bears'. Members also, overwhelmingly, stated that they joined the club and received from the club a social outlet, made new friends from the bear (Continued on page 4)

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community; who were welcoming, accepting, unpretentious and supportive. Survey responders appreciated and felt that the club organized a large number of venues and 'events in addition to just bars', provided parties at members homes and offered and supported charity work.

How Would You Like To See The Club Grow?

When asked how responders would like to see the club grow and develop, responders expressed a desire to see more numerous and a wider array of activities. The activities which were requested included, more private parties at peoples homes, games nights, concerts and festivals, out of town events, support of more TCC events, and more diverse events' such as 'leather and biker events'.

Respondents also expressed a desire to see more voluntary & charitable events; such as Aids Services of Austin or Habitats for Humanity. In addition to promoting charitable contributions and events, survey responders felt it was important for the group to receive recognition for its contributions and to more actively promote the club and its objectives to the public as a whole.

It was also proposed that the club grow through its offerings of activities and for more of the current membership to actively participate in events. It was also suggested that the board attend all scheduled events.

Survey respondents also proposed that the group grow by increasing its membership and the diversity of the membership; through active recruitment. However, a number of respondents stressed that the group should be mindful of both its size and of supporting its current membership.

Other Respondent Comments

Before we discuss the concerns which were expressed by survey respondents, throughout the survey, I would like to review some of the other general comments offered by respondents. Survey respondents were consistently very positive and supportive of the current and previous boards. Respondents appreciated the board for both conducting the survey and admired the previous and current boards' contributions and work for the membership. In addition, respondents offered special thanks to Ed, Jack, Mickey, John, Marcus, Mike and Peter for their contributions and work for the group.

Respondent Concerns

As mentioned survey respondents expressed a number of concerns about the club, throughout the survey. These included:

- the 'hope that the group was more friendly a open than what was heard in community about the club'
- that the club was 'cliquey and elitist'
- the 'risk that the club grows too large & would break up'



Commentary

I would like to preface my commentary by stating that my comments represent my own personal views and I am not speaking for the board as a whole. My commentary is meant to provide my perspective of the survey, the club and some of my own personal concerns. I believe that the commentary can be used to promote thought and dialogue from the membership, in order for us to come together and positively shape the club and its future direction. It is my belief that only when we accomplish this as a whole, do we have a strong and long term successful club. I don't personally believe that a club can flourish without the consent and participation of a significant proportion of its membership.

Over the past several years of membership, I have felt an increasing desire to help to address a number of concerns which I had developed or observed. Initially, in part, I conceived the survey in order to determine if my concerns were those of just a single individual or if they were shared by the group as a whole. From the survey, it appears that my concerns are at least in part shared by survey respondents.

I was delighted and awed by the response to the survey and the overwhelming positive feeling that respondents expressed for the club. I was also ecstatic by the feelings of the respondents toward the club, feelings which had prompted me to join the group and which unite us as a club. I have now been a member of the group for about 3 years and joined the group when I returned to Austin and the US.

I have been fortunate to join the club without having heard any negative comments regarding the club. However, I have heard a number of comments over the years about the club, which originate from outside of the club. These include negative perceptions of the club, such as the club is a sex club and that the club is elitist or cliquey. As a member I have personally found these perceptions to be completely unfounded and am reassured that my views are resoundingly supported by the membership, through the survey.

However, I believe these concerns, and views from outside of the club, should be addressed by the group as a whole. I believe that these perceptions may have originated in the past, when the group was much smaller and had a different social agenda. In the past the group has had a more overt sexual orientation and has been more un-accepting of the broader community. It has been through the efforts and hard work of the past board, that these miss-perceptions have been indirectly addressed. This was achieved by promoting membership into the group, encouraging well attended social activities and promoting a sense of welcoming community, all of which have seen the group flourish.

The current board, are seeking to further dispel any missperceptions that the public may have of our community. We are seeking to accomplish this by promoting social and voluntary outreach and by cultivating an atmosphere which is both welcoming within and outside the group. In addition individual members can help dispel misconceptions from outside of the club, by positively emphasizing the club and encouraging nonmembers to join our events and get to know us.

As we are now a group of about 150 members, have an annual cash flow of about \$15,000 and have increased legal

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obligations, I believe it is important that we think and open dialogue about how the group is to sustain itself and develop in the future. The group has grown considerable over the recent years, which has been due to the considerable efforts and work of the previous board. However, it is my belief that this growth has potentially generated a number of problems for our future.

I believe it is vital that we continue to support our current membership and that we continue to promote close social interaction within the membership. I also believe that if we continue to increase in size, that we must address how we are to manage an increased membership and calendar effectively. The previous board invested considerable time and effort into managing the club, promoting events and membership. However, I believe, the resulting increase in size and number of events has created additional responsibilities and time constraints for individual board members. Unfortunately I question whether this level of effort by any individual current or future board member is sustainable or even desirable. I, therefore, would recommend that we consider diversifying the number of positions on the board, so that no one board member is over burden. I also recommend that we continue to create committees to oversee our larger events and that we strongly promote individual member contributions of time and involvement in their club. I believe that is apparent from the survey that members value their club and that many members have expressed a desire to volunteer both within and outside the club. I would encourage volunteering within the club and outside.

I believe that the more members that are actively involved with managing the club, the closer and stronger our community becomes. I also feel that having more active involvement of members will help to place less time constraints upon individual members and also aid members understanding of the work that goes on behind the scenes to make this club vibrant and fun. I believe that this approach also champions democracy in our club, by increasing the number of voices who are actively involved in decision making. Ultimately, it is my belief that the group is in the hands of the membership and is ultimately the membership. And that the membership should play an active part in the direction of their group. I believe that this can represent the wishes of most members to be a part of a welcoming community of close friends.
